We had an amazing furlough in Florida this year. God is good, all the time and especially for those who truly seek Him. We had a full five weeks visiting several churches, ministries, family and friends on this trip, and we believe that it was very fruitful. We are so excited to see the Lord opening new doors with CAV, CC Gulf Coast and First Nazarene of Naples. The Lord continues to strengthen our relationships with CCSS and Ride Nature. *I know your deeds. See, I have set before you an open door which no one is able to shut, for you have little power, and have kept My word, and have not renounced or denied My name... Revelations 3:8.* While we were in Florida we were able to visit several new home groups and meet so many new brothers and sisters in Christ. What a blessings

to see so many people with a heart for world missions. We definitely serve a missionary God. Daisy was also invited to speak to the CAV woman's bible study with over 250 ladies. She shared her story on how God changed her life and how He is using her now. Meanwhile, Craig had 12 speaking engagements sharing God's word and what the Lord is doing in Peru through our ministries. It is always a pleasure raising mission's awareness and sharing about the wonderful works of God. We never want to take credit for what the Lord is doing, and He deserves all the glory for every changed life. **We are praying about using business for a plan for missions.** The Lord has placed upon our hearts the need to follow through with what He started in Huacho back in 2010. It is always a challenge to raise support, and we believe whole heartily where God guides, He provides. There is that area of meeting basic needs to survive and being effective on the mission field. The Lord has given us a three-fold vision on how to be self-sustaining as missionaries, and reach a whole new people group, while creating jobs for people in our church. A surf café, called the "La Casa De Ride Nature." Our area in Huacho

Peru is growing into a major city and has become the best kept secret for people wanting to get a break from Lima. The city of Huacho has grown from 39,000 people to 65,000 people in five years. We have one major mall and the city is building a second one. The need for young people to have a healthy, safe environment to go to in the evening is priceless. A great part of our city's population is made up of college students and many of them are tired of going to the discotheque and cantinas. The need for an amazing coffee house is in great demand.

### Surf Shop in the Café

We have partnered with Ride Nature and CAV to help this vision come to pass. We are in the development stage now and are looking for sponsors and investors who would be willing to help us with the capital to get this venture off the ground and out of the planning stage. We have been reaching people through action sports for five years, and there is no surf shop for 350 miles in either direction from Huacho. The surfing on our coast is famous, and we have been working with the Christian Surfers for years evangelizing our beaches, but taking it a step further and providing a service while we share the gospel would be huge.



### School of Ministry SOM

We have been encouraged by Pastor Orlando to take the next step in many areas in our ministry and one of them is by starting a School of Ministry here in Huacho. This is a 52 week intense discipleship training that prepares servant leaders for the ministry. We have five men that desire to serve the Lord in this capacity, and Daisy has 5 young ladies who desire to be used by the Lord in ministry as well. We also have been praying about having interns

come here for practical missionary training, and we have Eduardo from Ride Nature coming in 2016 to serve here in Huacho, after his intense discipleship in the states. We will be receiving a team from Ride Nature on December 12 and this will be our last mission team for this year. We will be doing a Surf Camp, and a skate competition during their stay. They also will be bringing some surf products down to help us start our new surf shop. Reaching the next generation through extreme sports has been very effective.

### Changed lives
